

120 participants gathered at Doylestown's Central Park for the 4th annual Walk to Empower. Together, they made strides to end dating and domestic violence in Bucks County and raised \$4,000.

Offers services to victims of domestic violence and their children, providing the opportunity to make choices and changes that lead to safer and healthier living.


