A Woman's Place envisions a society where all individuals are SAFE in their relationships and can flourish.

► The Bucks County business community plays a vital role in AWP's success by providing in-kind donations of products and services that would otherwise need to be budgeted for. This allows more funds to be devoted to direct support services such as counseling and education and outreach to the greater community.



► **Chocolate Lover's Fantasy** held a sweet 20th anniversary celebration at Bucks County Community College. Guests generously gave \$13,900 in the good will auction for The Safe Options Project. These funds allowed AWP to renovate its full service shelter for increased efficiency and client safety.

► AWP's **In Full Swing** thrift store thrives in its new Doylestown location. 100% of net proceeds support free client services such as the 24-hour hotline, first response callouts, and legal advocacy.



► We were pleased to honor the Bucks County Health Improvement Partnership (BCHIP) at the **Annual Breakfast & Community Recognition Ceremony**. They are true champions of the movement to end domestic violence and work tirelessly alongside AWP to address the issue from the health care perspective.











► An empty place at the table following the **Domestic Violence Awareness Candlelight Vigil** is a reminder to mourn those lost even as we celebrate the survivors. It calls to us to connect with one another and renew our resolve to empower women and end intimate and domestic violence for all.



► The Norman Raab Foundation's "Philanthropy Today" Program gives area students the opportunity to research and donate to Bucks County nonprofits. AWP was honored to be chosen by both Middle Bucks Institute of Technology and Palisades High School students. Funds like these help make possible free monthly workshops that build skills and help individuals flourish.

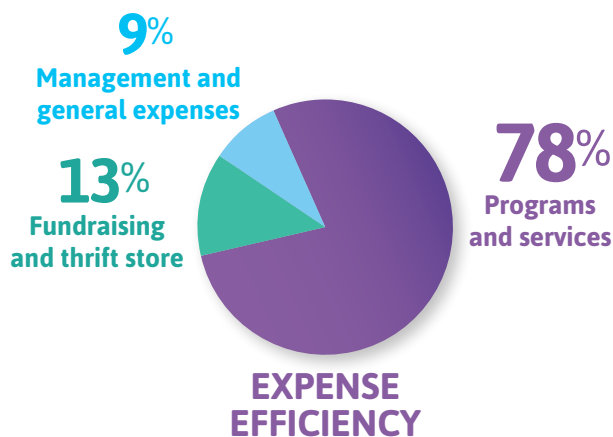

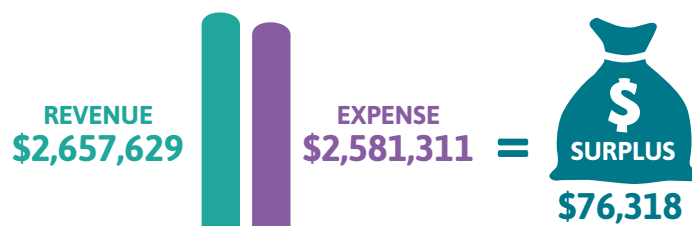
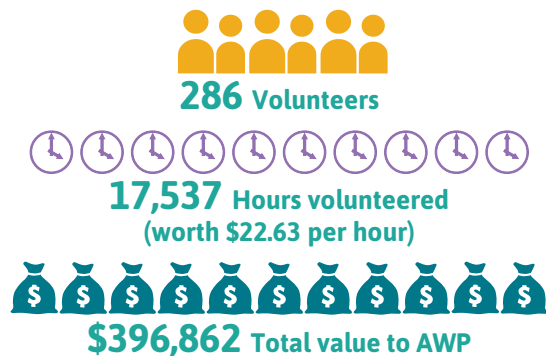
Alex Leone participates in AWP's monthly **Lean In** program, an intimate circle of encouragement that inspires adults and teens to face challenges and achieve their goals.



A Woman's Place is a community-based social change organization committed to the empowerment of women and to ending intimate and domestic violence for all.



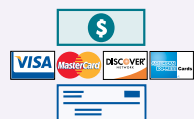
