**Purpose of Position**: The Therapist will provide culturally competent, trauma informed services to survivors of domestic violence who are experiencing varying levels of difficulty due to the domestic violence they have experienced in their lifetime.

# **Essential Functions/Responsibilities:**

- 1. Provide high quality, compassionate and trauma informed therapy to adult survivors of domestic violence as referred by other AWP programs.
- 2. Provide therapy to survivors in both individual and group settings that allow them to process and heal from the trauma associated with domestic violence.
- 3. Provide individual, group and family therapy as needed, ensuring that actions taken are focused on changing the conditions of each individual's life.
- 4. Deliver enhanced trauma informed therapeutic services to survivors of domestic violence, ages 14 and above.
- 5. Provide in-service training as needed.
- 6. Participate in client case management and goal planning with other AWP staff.
- 7. Maintain accurate and timely records and statistical data.
- 8. Assist with the supervision, mentoring and direction to student interns.
- 9. Identify and report on meaningful measurements of the community benefit of AWP's Counseling Program.
- 10. Adhere to the confidentiality policy and other policies of AWP.
- 11. Contribute to the positive environment of the agency.
